## VARILUX OPTOMETRY STUDENT BOWL ENDS IN A TIE FOR THE FIRST TIME IN EVENT HISTORY

The University of Alabama at Birmingham and Nova Southeastern University Share Bragging
Rights and the Eminent Crystal Trophy

DALLAS – June 28, 2013 – Essilor of America, the nation's leading manufacturer of optical lenses, celebrated the 22<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of the crowd-favorite Varilux Optometry Student Bowl<sup>™</sup>, held at this year's Optometry's Meeting in San Diego. Students showed up with signs, war chants, and matching t-shirts to cheer on the contestant representing their specific school. A student representative from all schools and colleges of optometry answered optometry-related questions while their peers cheered them on.

For the first time in event history a tie for first place was declared between David Zimmerman, representing the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), and Blake Dornstauder, representing Nova Southeastern University. Judges came prepared for the unlikely instance of a tie and planned to present the two contestants with a tie-breaker question. At the request of Zimmerman and Dornstauder, the tie-breaker question was omitted allowing the two contestants to share the honor of winning first place at the coveted event.

Given the tie, UAB and Nova will each receive the \$1,000 prize for first place. The crystal trophy will be split between the winning schools where it will spend six months at UAB and six months at Nova. Brandon Prete, representing the University of Waterloo School of Optometry, came in third place taking home \$500.

The winning question, "What vertical prism imbalance is induced when a patient reads 10 mm below the optical centers of the following prescription: OD: -3.00 -2.00 X 180, OS: -2.00 -0.50 x 090?" was correctly answered by both David Zimmerman, UAB, and Blake Dornstauder, Nova, resulting in the tie for first place.

Last year's Spirit Award Winner, The Ohio State University College of Optometry, created a humorous music video detailing the rules of the Varilux Optometry Student Bowl. The video is available for viewing on YouTube at YouTube.com/VariluxSuperBowl. State University of New York was chosen as this year's Spirit Award winner which in turn gives them the honor of creating the rules video for the 2014 competition.
